VoteRiders offers free resources to partner organizations to help voters cast a ballot that counts.

Voter ID laws are complicated, confusing, and ever-changing. VoteRiders is here to help. Our always-updated and free voter ID tools and services help partners raise awareness of ID laws and ensure that the communities they serve are ready to vote with confidence.

Our diverse and ever-growing partner community is essential in our mission to ensure that voter ID laws do not prevent any eligible voter from casting a ballot that counts. Since 2012, we've worked with over 1,500 partner organizations to share ID information and free help with voters.

Voter ID Information Cards

Our newly redesigned Voter ID Information Cards provide information on accepted forms of ID and any available alternatives for voting in person. They also share our Helpline number and website URL for questions and additional information, such as on ID for mail-in voting.

Available in English and Spanish for all 50 states and DC, our Voter ID Information Cards are an effective addition to any voter registration, get-out-the-vote, or other similar effort.

VoteRiders prints and ships Voter ID Information Cards to nonprofit, nonpartisan organizations for FREE via an <u>order form</u> on our website. Cards can also be <u>downloaded</u> and used digitally in text-banking and shared on partner websites.



Digital Resources

<u>VoteRiders.org</u> is a one-stop shop for voter ID information. Our site offers a <u>state-by-state map</u> with comprehensive and constantly-updated information on ID requirements. It also offers resources for specific communities such as <u>students</u>, <u>transgender and non-binary</u> individuals, and <u>voters with disabilities</u>. Many VoteRiders partners share a link to our state map on their websites and utilize graphics from our social media kit.



Voter ID Trainings

VoteRiders staff are available to lead in-person or virtual trainings on voter ID in English and Spanish, or to participate in events organized by partner organizations. Trainings can be national in scope, state-specific, or focus on the ID needs of specific communities. All trainings include an overview of our free tools and services and how they can be incorporated into partners' programming.

Direct Voter Contact Partnerships

Partners that canvass, distribute pledge-to-vote cards, phonebank, text-bank, or use online voter registration portals can refer voters in need of ID assistance to VoteRiders.

Partners include a short question in their outreach scripts (such as "Do you have a current state ID or driver's license?") and refer those saying "no" or "I don't know" to VoteRiders. VoteRiders then follows up with these voters, answering any questions and providing them with free help if needed to obtain an ID.





Helpline & Chatbot

VoteRiders operates a year-round Helpline (**866.ID.2.VOTE**) that voters can call, text, or email (**Helpline@VoteRiders.org**) with questions related to voter ID or to request free ID help. Assistance is available in English and Spanish.

Our Chatbot is run through Facebook Messenger (m.me/VoteRiders), Instagram (DM us @VoteRiders), and SMS, or can be accessed via our website. It provides voters with automated information on voter ID laws and transitions to personalized assistance when needed. Partners can share this resource with their communities by linking to it in text-banks, on their website, and via other outreach methods.

Voter ID Assistance

VoteRiders provides **free help to individuals to obtain an accepted form of ID for voting**, including: obtaining vital documents like a birth certificate, covering the costs of an ID, providing transportation to and from ID-issuing offices, and more. We provide this support virtually as well as through Voter ID Clinics, where staff or trained volunteers are hosted by partners to assist voters onsite.

VoteRiders can also train partner organization staff and volunteers to undertake ID assistance work, with VoteRiders covering all associated document and transportation costs.

Voter Contact and Outreach Events

With an ever-growing community of 10,000+ volunteers, VoteRiders regularly organizes virtual and in-person events to contact at-risk voters via letter-writing, text-banking, and phone calls. We often organize these events collaboratively with partner organizations, alerting targeted voters to ID rules where they live and offering VoteRiders' free ID help if needed.
