An effective way to increase voter turnout is to create a plan, which encourages people to identify any potential barriers they might encounter when voting. Encourage your friends, family members, and community leaders to make a plan to vote and encourage others to do the same!

Sample vote plan:

Instructions to complete the vote plan above:

- “I will vote” — How will you cast a ballot? Circle your response: Early / In Person / By mail (which includes absentee)
- “At this time” — When will you go to the polls, if not voting by mail-in or absentee ballot? Circle AM/PM and write down the time you intend to vote.
- “At this location” — Where will you vote? Write down the address of your polling station, vote center, or ballot drop-box. If you plan to return your ballot by mail, write that in.
- “I will get to the polls by” — How will you get to the polls on or before election day? Circle the mode of transportation you plan to use. If you plan to mail-in your ballot, skip this question.
- “I will need” — List what you need to bring to the polls in order to vote, such as a voter registration card or photo ID. If mailing in your ballot, write in stamp.
